Packaged Liquor Sales

Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to outline the conditions that may apply to hotels and special facility licences that are authorised to sell packaged liquor with regard to the area from which packaged liquor may be sold.

Conditions

The following conditions apply to all new applications for a hotel or special facility class of licence where takeaway packaged liquor will be sold. This includes applications for approval of alterations or redefinitions to existing premises, the removal of an existing licence or in any other case the Director deems appropriate.

In accordance with regulation 11 of the *Liquor Control Regulations 1989*, plans accompanying an application must show the use of each room. Consequently, the area of the premises that is dedicated to on-site consumption as well as the area dedicated to the sale of liquor to be consumed off-site must be clearly identified.

1. The Director may identify on the approved plans that part of the licensed premises used for the sale of packaged liquor.
2. The Director may impose a condition on a licence restricting the area from which packaged liquor may be sold.
3. The Director may impose a condition restricting the consumption of liquor in the area identified for packaged liquor sales to tastings only.
